SYNOPSIS**

The St. Louis Office for Developmental Disability Resources (DD Resources) is accepting proposals from currently contracted agencies to provide round-trip, non-emergency medical transportation for individuals with developmental disabilities and their primary caregivers to Logan College of Chiropractic and/or to DD Resources.

I. Statement of Purpose

DD Resources has identified multiple unmet needs of DD Resources eligible consumers. One area of need is round-trip transportation for consumers and their caregivers to specialized medical treatment at Logan College of Chiropractic and/or DD Resources.

II. Scope of Project

Individuals with developmental disabilities can live safely and independently with the right amount of supports and services. This project will specifically assist consumers with specialized medical needs and their caregivers with safe, round-trip transportation to and from physical therapy appointments. Appointments will be held either at Logan College of Chiropractic or DD Resources. Transportation will be provided from a pre-arranged pick-up location to Logan College of Chiropractic or DD Resources.

Interested agencies should submit the cost of a one-way trip and proof of reliable and accessible vehicles.

III. Review of Proposal

A review committee consisting of DD Resources Staff and members of the DD Resources Board of Directors will evaluate all proposals.

The DD Resources Committee(s) will forward to the full Board a recommendation regarding which proposal should receive the award.
